
WHO WE ARE: Our Mission

The Christian Women's Job Corps of Tyler, Inc. equips women with job skills and life skills in a Christ-centered environment

WHAT WE DO: Our Programs

We help women in crisis or chronic situations, including poverty, find their personal power and self-sufficiency by becoming adequately trained to secure employment. We nurture an environment in which women create their personal life plan, including strategies to adapt to life, securing a job paying a living wage, as well as higher education, if desired. Often, women struggle to find jobs due to lack of skills, a deficiency in computer literacy, and inability to create a plan to become self-sufficient. Our job training and life skills coursework prepares women to confidently find employment with skills and abilities employers in Smith County desire.

SPRING SESSION: February-May and FALL SESSION: September-November January and June SESSIONS: Level II Instruction



Computer Skills: keyboarding, MS Word and Excel, internet navigation, Quickbooks (Level II only)

Job Training: Making yourself a valuable employee, job retention, and promotion

Ageless Resume Writing and Cover Letter: how to highlight your strengths and get hired

Interview Skills: how to respond to a prospective employer with confidence and quantified skills; practiced behavioral interview skills Life Skills: Keeping your personal life in order so you don't lose your job when life falls apart

Bible Study: how to apply Biblical principles to life's problems, Godly character, integrity and honesty

Encouragement: new friends that will encourage and support you in your professional goals and serve as a mentor

Job Search: guided help for seeking and applying for jobs

Women's Fund grant award The Christian Women's Job Corps of Tyler wishes to thank The Women's Fund of Smith County for the \$64,582 grant award. The generous grant award permits CWJC to move forward with our PLANNED RENOVATION AND EXPANSION OF SERVICES in 2018.

The building renovations include architectural renderings for maximization of space and bringing all electrical, wiring and computer laboratory configurations sufficient to handle additional computers. The 2018 planned expansion to a facility of 6,000 sq. ft., allows for an on-site counseling room, virtual technology library, hosting hiring fairs with business and industry in Smith County for the onsite hiring of alumni and students. A fully equipped training room will include laptop computers, software and security, as well as employment training curriculum. Building safety and security is paramount and will be updated. Future planning includes offering a path for Microsoft certification in Word and Excel. When the project is fully completed, The Women's Fund of Smith County in partnership with CWJC, will substantially increase the number of women receiving Employment Training.

We teach women to become their own inspiration - "I did it!" There is a support system of job coaches, personal mentors and practical lessons from personal budgeting, car repair, to preparation for college entry. We love Genevieve G. and her beautiful French accent. "When I started at CWJC it was a very, very bad situation that brought me to Christian Women's Job Corps. I am from Canada and had no family here in Tyler. I found myself in an unsafe home situation which was frightening. I had no job, no skills, no confidence, no money, no friends – only fear and a feeling of hopelessness. I started attending the training program and learned so much!

First, I learned to see myself the way God sees me. I learned that I could learn! I was taught how to set healthy boundaries, and the practical tools necessary to get a job and make good choices to change my circumstances. Although I was still afraid, slowly my life began to change. Gaining computer skills was so important. I was able to find a job before I graduated. I now work for a local French restaurant, love what I do, travel and help train new employees. I also work as a computer teacher at CWJC in our evening classes. CWJC gave me so much more than employment training – it gave me confidence, knowledge and a safe place to grow. I have found beauty in the world again! Thank you!"

"I began my journey with CWJC as a volunteer teaching Jobs for Life in 2016. As a first-time volunteer, you are excited to contribute so that someone in need can be inspired or their life improved. Even after a short amount of time, you realize that you are the one being inspired. Your life is being greatly improved.

Giving dignity is at the very core of every program provided. Dignity is defined as "a sense of pride in oneself." When women come through our doors, they are often insecure, afraid, and feeling of little value to their families or the world. As they progress through our program, they learn the essential job skills and computer skills necessary to become gainfully employed and lift themselves from poverty, while also discovering who they are in Christ. They uncover their own unique talents, skills, and gifts.

I transitioned from a volunteer to serving as the Site Coordinator. I am, however, still inspired on a daily basis by the strength, beauty, and dignity of our graduates." Dr. Lucille O'Neal is more than just Shaquille O'Neal's mother. She was in Tyler for a conference and decided to stop by Christian Women's Job Corps to meet and speak with the women in our program. Her insights and stories on overcoming obstacles with the help of God truly left a lasting impact on the women. Dr. O'Neal generously donated an autographed copy of her book to each CWJC graduate in the Spring 2018 session.

meet trakisha clay the face of homelessness in Tyler

"Hi, my name is Trakisha Clay and I graduated from Christian Women's Job Corps on May 8th. When I walked to CWJC, I was homeless and living under the Bridge. I don't regret this experience, for it has helped shape the woman that God has before you today. I WAS the face of homelessness in our community.

I came to CWJC in January, and felt immense love, friendship and received an excellent education. I learned to write an ageless resume, successfully interview, and how to confidently and professionally present myself to get a job.

My husband and I are now both employed and no longer homeless. The employment training program valued me as a person. I currently work for two employers in Smith County – Hangers of Hope and The Hamptons Senior Living.

I now shake hands with people in our community who do not avoid eye contact with me, or, tell me 'Oh, I'm so sorry.' Instead, I meet people who look at me with tears in their eyes and say, 'I'm so proud of you!' I can tell you that when you have felt hopeless, having someone believe in you and share your joy in finding a job is priceless! I no longer feel the shame of being less-than. Thank you!"
